Great Kanto Earthquake by Daisuke Suzuki

A large earthquake last Saturday on 1 September has killed almost 142,000 people and destroyed 250,000 homes. An additional 450,000 homes have been destroyed by fire.

The earthquake occurred at 11:58 AM and was centered in Sagami Bay with a magnitude of 8.19. Hardest hit were Yokohama and Tokyo, though the prefectures of Chiba, Saitama, Ibaraki, Shizuoka, and Yamanashi were also damaged. Taro Yamamoto, a banker, has estimated property damage to be one billion U.S. dollars. One Yokohama resident, Ume Shintani, said that the weather that morning had been hot and there was a strong wind and an early morning rain. Many people had been cooking lunch when the first of 200 earthquakes that day was felt just before noon. The timing of this first earthquake contributed to many of the fires. Several aftershocks were felt in the following days, with 300 recorded on September 2nd, and another 300 from September 3rd through the 5th.
